

Minutes of the regular Village of Mulliken meeting held March 9, 2026

Meeting called to order by President Dennis Kepitis at 7:09 p.m.

Members Present: Sherry Kempf, Will Simon, Brandon Lambrix, Bob McCausey, Greg Guilford, and Corey Stiles

Pledge of Allegiance

Approval of February 2, 2026 meeting made by Sherry and second by Corey. 6 yays 0 nays motion carries.

Treasures Report: Kelli presented the council with the monthly detail transaction report. She explained why the money received from the state in March actually has to be accounted for in February. Sherry made a motion to accept the treasures report and Will seconds. 6 yays 0 nays motion carries.

New Business: 1) Kelli presented the council the budget numbers for the 2026-27 fiscal year. She explained what was in each account and which account was over and which account was under budget for the 2025-26 fiscal year. With that information she increased the amount budgeted in the accounts that were over and decreased the ones that were under in each, major, local and sewer accounts. Bob made a motion to accept the 2026-27 budget as presented and Corey seconds. 6 yays 0 nays motion carries. 2) Kelli will need a motion at the next meeting to approve the moving of monies in the three accounts to balance the 2025-26 budget. 3) We received a packet from John Huver. Kelli reached out to our attorney and she has contacted the court and we should be hearing an update soon.

Committee Reports: 1) Sherry called consumers on the light on Eaton Hwy. and they are going to address it. 2) Brandon found a spot of sidewalk at 350 French St. that needs replaced. Chad will look into to it. 3) Will is concerned about a resident on French St. that has their sump pump draining in there front yard.

Maintenance Report: 1) Dennis thanked Bob and Chad for all his help with the snow and salt. 2) The pump and valve at the lagoons will be replaced in the next 30 days. 2) Will helped Chad apply for a grant to get a permit for Chad to do the duck weed control at the lagoons vs hiring it out. 3) The big tractor needs maintenance. 4) Chad would like to buy a new pump for the air compressor. 4) We still need to t.v. the discharge line.

Limited Public Comment: Andy Shaver, County Commissioner, stated that Sunfield Township is putting up a windmill farm and are they approaching the nearby townships, including Roxand. The county approved the MOU for the recycling center. He also went over some of the mileages they are trying to pass.

Ordinance Report: There are several unlicensed cars that need to be addressed.
